# *Port Arthur (Oldest jail in Tasmania)*

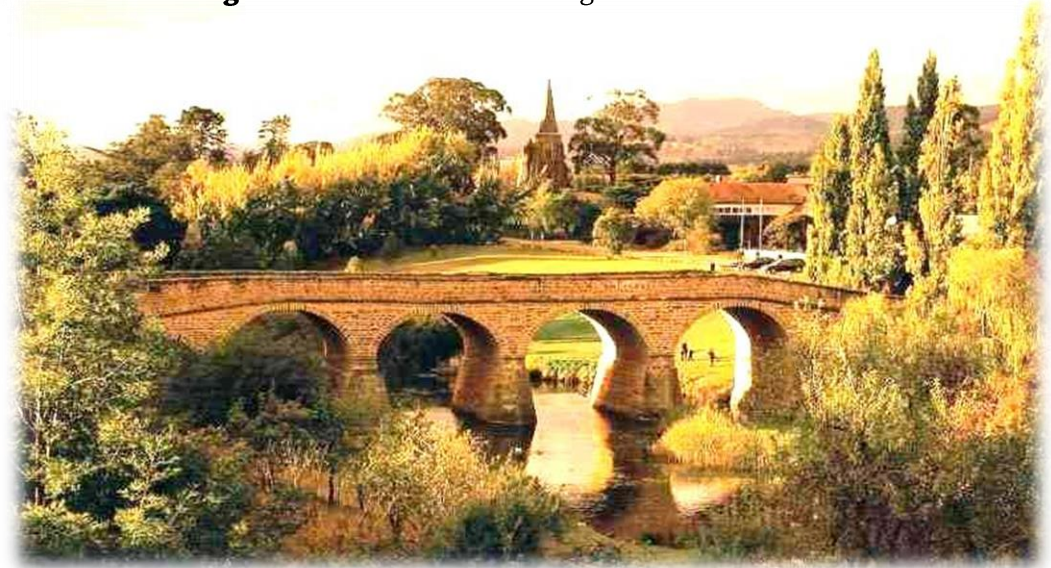
*A taste of Tasmania itself. An Introductory Tour*



**Port Arthur** is the best preserved reminder of Australia's penal history and is also the most visited place in Tasmania. It **opened in 1830 to house convicts** who had committed further crimes. Over 13,000 convicts spent time here till it closed in 1877. Today it is a collection of restored and ruined buildings set out on a large scale the historic site is made up of ruins of a roofless sandstone church, hospital, guard room, library, penitentiary and boat building yard as well as some intact buildings, including the commandant's house and the model prison. In recent years some of the grounds and gardens have been returned to their former glory.

Port Arthur, as a penal settlement was a self-supporting industrial centre which included a timber and boat building industry. There was brick making, shoe making wheat growing and even a flour mill. It was all built with convict labour. The impressive architecture, delightful gardens and chilling prison facilities survive today for you to explore. A visit to Port Arthur is an unforgettable experience. The site covers 40 hectares and over 30 historic buildings. The Port Arthur and Coal Mines Historic Sites are two of eleven historic places that together form the Australian Convict Sites World Heritage Property.

From Launceston we travel south on a comfortable coach and seeing The town of Richmond, on the coal rivers, one of Australia's oldest and best preserved towns. **Richmond Bridge** is the oldest freestone bridge still in use in Australia.



This beautiful village provides a glimpse of what life might have been like in Tasmania's colonial era. We will stop by at **The Tasman National Park** Lookout which provides a perfect view of the coast (The Tasman Peninsula) and also **The Tessellated Pavement** – an incredible rock platform with a surface which looks as if it has been laid by stonemasons. Absolutely fantastic work back in the old days!

**Eaglehawk Neck**, the narrow stretch of land that separates the Tasman Peninsula from the main land. It was here where sentries were posted to ensure that no convicts could escape. A Line of barking snarling dogs were chained and kept half staved as an added barrier to prevent escape. **Doo Town** - A small group of holiday homes in picturesque location. All the houses in this settlement have Doo I their name with a name plate attached to each house such as Love Me Doo or Do Little. Close to Doo town is the Blow Hole, **The Tasman Arch, The Devils Kitchen** and **Waterfall Bay**.

We will spend a night in Port Arthur! – Overnight accommodation arranged at the Port Arthur Holiday Park in dormitory-styled accommodation where there is cooking facilities. You'll need to bring warm clothing, blankets, towel etc. Meals are not included in this trip so bring something for lunch, dinner & breakfast or you may choose to enjoy some lovely food at the café if you wish to.
