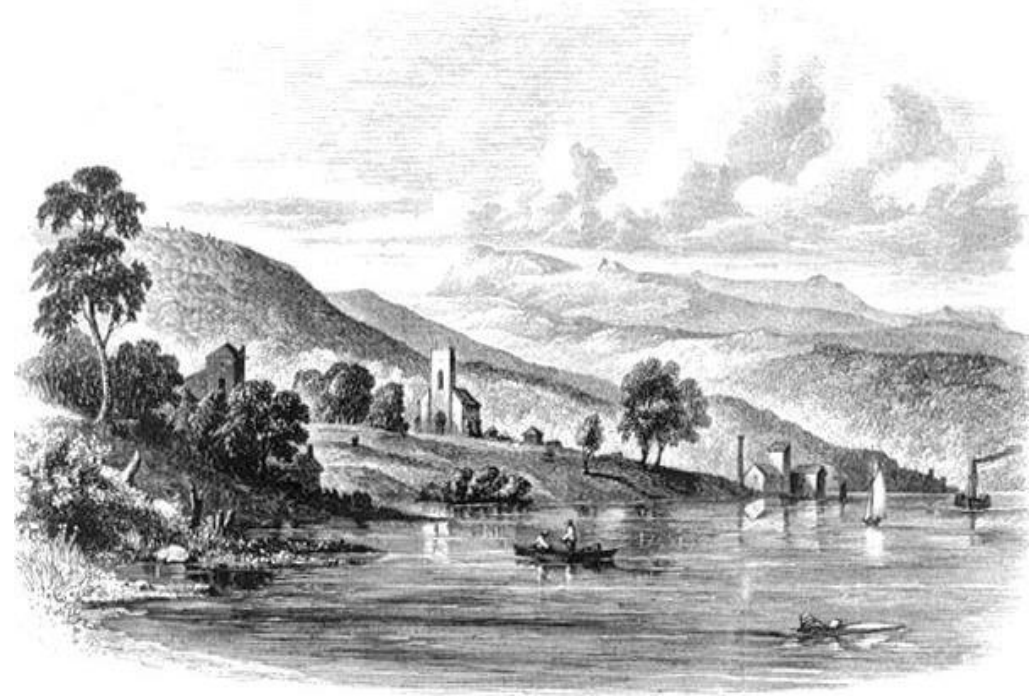

# The Tamar Valley

*A taste of Tasmania itself. An Introductory Day Tour*

Let us take you on a trip from Launceston along the Tamar Valley which is full of Tasmanian experiences. It is a unique 64 km from the ocean to the City of Launceston.

The Tamar River's waters are tidal and wind through orchards, vineyards, forested hills and rolling grazing land with historic buildings and even a gold mine.

Travel to **Lilydale Falls** on a comfortable coach. The short walk to the falls is through temperate rain forest and follows a gently flowing stream. The falls are in two levels.

**Hillwood Berry Farm** allows you to experience the sweeter side of farming with freshly picked or Pick Your Own Strawberries, Raspberries, Loganberries, Blackberries and Currants.



**Low Head Pilot Station** established in 1806 is Australia's oldest continually used pilot stations with buildings dating back to 1838. It was once the 3rd busiest port in Australia. From here, Melbourne and Adelaide were nurtured until these settlements became self-sufficient.

**Low Head Lighthouse and Historic Fog Horn.** At the entrance to the Tamar River, you will find Australia's third oldest light station which was established in 1833. See below the deserted beach which fronts on to Bass Strait.

**George Town** is the third oldest town in Australia and is where Colonel Paterson landed in 1804 to commence settlement of Northern Tasmania.

Cross the **Tamar River via the Batman Bridge** which is at the river's narrowest point. See the water rush and ebb by with the change of tide.

**Beaconsfield historic gold town** where on the 9th May 2006, two miners were trapped underground for 14 nights at a depth of nearly 1km. In the park outside of the mine, there is a heritage home and school house display.



We will stop at **Low Head** for an Aussie BBQ lunch on the banks of the Tamar River.

Travel along the **Tamar River** passing the settlements of **Devoit, Gravelly Beach** and stopping at **Roservears** for views across Tamar River to **Windermere**.
